in which he was betrayed our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you.



My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually in my heart. I embrace You as if you were already there, and I unite myself wholly to You. # VALIDATED PARKING FOR CHESTNUT STREET GARAGE IS AVAILABLE ON SUNDAYS.

Beginning Sunday, December 21, Validation will be electronic [not tickets]. Simply drive into the parking garage. Your license plate will be scanned as you enter and exit. Please keep your license plate number and smart phone (if you would like to use it) with you to complete the validation at Zion. The is a smart phone option, and there is an option to validate without a smart phone.

OPTION 1: You can enroll at a website provided by Zion from your smart phone. After completing the sign-in process, you can delete the payment information. When you come into Zion, you can scan the CHESTNUT STREET GARAGE QR validation code which will make parking free. The QR validation code will be posted in the entrance way or just inside the entrance to fellowship hall. You will need to scan the QR validation code every Sunday.

OPTION 2: DOES NOT REQUIRE SMART PHONE. A representative from Zion, from a smart phone or laptop, will enter your license plate into a designated link to validate your parking.

Validated parking is also available for the Lower Amtrak Lot — only on Sundays. Scan the QR Code in the lot and follow the prompts to enter your information. You will be asked to enter a credit card number or other payment information when you initially sign-in. After completing the sign-in process, you can delete the payment information. When you come into Zion, you can scan the LOWER AMTRAK LOT QR validation code which will make the parking free. The QR validation code will be posted in the entrance way or just inside the entrance to fellowship hall.
