## **THE COMMUNION**

*All baptized Christians are welcome to the Table of the Lord. As Christians in the Lutheran tradition, we believe in the Real Presence of Christ in, with, and under the bread and wine/grape juice. Non-baptized persons are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing.*

*Communion participants are invited to come forward to receive the Body of Christ and consume it. Then take an empty cup from the tray and proceed to the assisting ministers to receive the Blood of Christ. The first pouring chalice contains wine; the second grape juice. After receiving the body and blood of Christ, please place the empty cup in the bowl provided and return to your pew.*

*For those who are not partaking of the sacrament during this service, you are invited to silently pray the following prayer, The Spiritual Communion:*

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

I love You above all things,

and I desire to receive You in my soul.

Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally,

come at least spiritually in my heart.

I embrace You as if you were already there,

and I unite myself wholly to You.

Never permit me to be separated from You.
