The article below is the twelfth and final installment in a series about spiritual practices illustrated by stained-glass windows in our worship space. The articles were written as part of one of the classes in the Doctor of Ministry Program from which Pastor Karin recently graduated. The article has been updated.



Ascension of Jesus: Worship & Joy While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God. – Luke 24:51-53 English Standard Version

As I began writing this series of newsletter articles on Zion's stained-glass windows, I never imagined that the final installment would appear at a time when we are not attending services in the main worship space. The good news is that we are actively working to complete the audio and visual recording system so that we can broadcast services from that beautiful space. This development will serve the congregation well into the future. There will be a consistent way for members to attend in-person as well as online and by phone. Visitors who would like to learn more about Zion's spiritual life before walking through the doors can first experience a service remotely.

Zion's church leadership continues to actively monitor current government policies as we plan for a return to in-person worship. We respect everyone's personal discernment regarding choosing to attend or not to attend an in-person worship service when that option becomes available.

As a smaller congregation, the ability for us to be together at the 10:15am Sunday service is essential. The goal is for online, phone, and in-person attendance to be available each Sunday. As we await that time, I pray that this image of the Ascension window and the reflection on the image will encourage your worship and prayer life.

When viewing the window depicting the Ascension of Jesus, you have to look up to see Christ. Entering the worship space at Zion, one's eye is drawn upward into the images of the tall windows and the high ceiling with decorative molding. The tops of the stained-glass windows contain images of castles, a reminder of the heavenly kingdom.

The whole space is different from a home, apartment, or office. The architecture and design serve to remind us that the kingdom of God has broken into earth with the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. That is Good News and cause for celebration and joy.

We do not need to be in a traditional church space to worship God, but the visual aids can help. Sometimes it's hard to see the presence Christ in the world or to sense His peace. A place that looks and feels different, or even otherworldly, can help us to enter into a sense of being in God's presence. Weekly worship helps keep us connected to God.

The challenge is to take the gratitude and joy of the worship service into the world when we leave a scared space. We are quick to gripe when things go wrong. How about more mini-celebrations when things go well, giving thanks to the One who created us and sustains us? How would moments of joyful worship during the week impact your life?

What an exciting time to be packing shoeboxes for children all around the world. Everyone needs to be shown love, and especially during these trying times. Your outpouring of love to support this project warms my heart. You have contributed \$610 in checks or cash, and others have bought toys that amounted to approximately \$120. It takes approximately between \$15 and \$16 to pack one box, so that means we have enough money to pack 45 boxes. I just got 2 checks today from parishioners at Good Shepherd and they gave enough to pack 5 more boxes, so we are up to 50. I also know one member of the congregation who is packing 2 boxes at their home, so that makes 52. Only God knows what our final count will be but we will keep collecting and packing during October. We will give you updates on Sundays during October. If you have a child or grandchild who would like to write a letter to one of the children, we will put it in one of the shoeboxes. They could even enclose a picture. Maybe they will get a response, but if not, remember they are doing it to the glory of God and to spread his love. You can still send monetary donations. The deadline for completing the boxes is October 31. The shoeboxes will be blessed during the November 8 Sunday worship service. # Bring the Annual German Reformation Meal to Your Home!

Chef Todd is sharing some favorite recipes from past Reformation Sunday Fellowship Meals.

#### ALMOND BUTTER CAKE

- 1 C butter, room temperature
- 1 C almond paste (not almond filling)
- 2 eggs
- 2 C sugar
- ½ t almond flavoring
- 2 C flour
- 1 egg white
- Sliced almonds

Coarse decorating sugar

- 1. In a large bowl, combine butter, almond paste, 2 eggs, sugar, and almond flavoring. Beat with an electric mixer on medium to high speed for 5 minutes or until light and fluffy. Add flour and blend well.
- 2. Spread batter into two 8" round cake pans that have been buttered, floured, and lined with parchment paper. In a small bowl, beat 1 egg white with 1 T water. Brush egg mixture on the two cakes. Sprinkle with sliced almonds and coarse sugar. Bake at 325° for 40 to 42 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the centers comes out clean.

#### PASTOR PEJACK'S "FAMOUS" SPICED APPLES

- 1 can opener
- 1 can of "Heat N Serve" spiced homestyle country apples,
- 1 C apple cider or apple juice
- 1. Using the can opener, remove the top of the can from the apples. Place apples in a saucepan or crock pot.
- 2. Heat apples until warm.
- 3. Thin syrup with up to one cup of cider to desired consistency.
- 4. Serve proudly.

#### GERMAN SAUSAGE WITH KRAUT (Bratwurst und Gedunstetes Sauerkraut)

- 4 lbs. sauerkraut
- ½ lb. sliced bacon, cut into 1 in. strips
- 2 onions, coarsely chopped
- 1 t caraway seeds
- 8 juniper berries, lightly crushed
- 1 whole clove
- 10 peppercorns
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 tart apple, peeled, cored and grated
- 1 t salt
- 1 t pepper
- 3 lbs. Bratwurst, frankfurters or white sausages (or a mix of those)
- 4 boneless smoked pork chops (3/4 in. thick)
- 3 C Riesling or other dry white wine, or apple juice
- 1. Soak the kraut in a bowl of cold water for 30 minutes. Drain and rinse. Squeeze dry and transfer the kraut to a large bowl; set aside.
- Meanwhile, in a large, heavy, non-reactive casserole, cook the bacon over moderately low heat until most of the fat has been rendered, about 5 minutes. Stir in the on ions. Reduce the heat to low, cover and cook, stirring occasionally, for 15 minutes longer.
- 3. Add the bacon and onion mixture to the kraut. Stir in the caraway seeds, juniper, clove, peppercorns, bay leaf, apple, salt and pepper.
- 4. Preheat oven to 350°. Place a ½-inch layer of the kraut in the bottom of a large case role pan or Dutch oven and top with some of the meats. Continue layering until all ingredients have been used, ending with a layer of kraut. Pour the wine on top and bring to a boil over high heat.
- 5. Cover the casserole and bake for 50 minutes. To serve, mound the kraut on a large platter and surround it with the meats.
